### SPEAKER SERIES

We are pleased to present a summer speaker series that commemorates the 150th anniversary of Kansas statehood and the Civil War. We have invited six historians to share with us those special people and events that shaped our history and built our community. Mark your calendars so you don't miss a single presentation.

June 14 - Paul Bahnmaier - former teacher and graduate of Emporia State University will tell how the small territorial capital of Lecompton played a large role in the history of Kansas, the United States, and the Presidential election of 1860.

June 21- Richard Wellman - a native of Jefferson Co., Ks and a member of the Santa Fe Trail Historical Society, Blackjack Battlefield Trust, and a volunteer at the Baldwin City Library "History Corner." Wellman will speak about the history and settling of Baldwin City.

June 28 - Martha Parker - representing the Clinton Museum, Ms. Parker will tell the story of the Wakarusa Valley from its historical beginning when it was first opened for settlement in 1855 to the present.

July 12 - Kerry Altenbernd - a third generation native of Douglas County, Kansas and Law Librarian at the Douglas County Law Library in Lawrence. The American Civil War had its beginnings on the Kansas/Missouri border. The first battle of that war was the Battle of Black Jack. Mr. Altenbernd will speak of how this battle and the men who were there had a major impact on the course of the war.

July 19 - Bruce MacTavish - Professor of history at Washburn University, Topeka, Kansas "Jayhawkers in the Deep South: Kansans and the War on Slavery in Mississippi." When the Seventh Kansas Cavalry entered Mississippi in 1862 they carried with them a commitment to attacking slavery. The aggressive actions taken by Kansans in Mississippi played a key role in ushering in a new social order. This talk will explore connections between the actions and ideals of the Seventh Kansas Cavalry, the liberation of black Mississippians and the rebirth of American freedom.

July 26 - Dale Vaughn - is a retired businessman, author and storyteller from Topeka. Mr. Vaughn has written "Black Jack '56" about the first battle of the Civil War, and "The Chance," a novel which brings to life the military activities of the 1<sup>st</sup> Kansas Colored regiment from 1862-1865. This regiment was the first Black troop to fight in uniform in the Civil War.

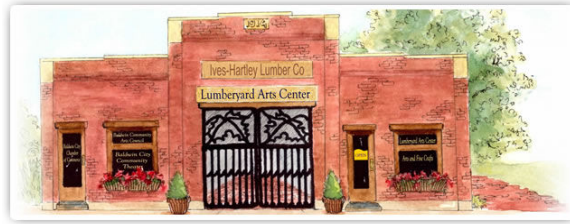
